# **Family Services**

- Created child files and sent invitations in Ready Rosie, Parenting App for all 9 classrooms.
- Attended BOY Professional Development training including: ECERS-3, Licensing consultant updates, and First Aid/CPR.
- Finished scanning new children documents to school data managers for creation of cumulative files.
- Attended training on Community engagement/Trauma Resilience, Empathy, and Early Childhood Impact Summit during the summer months.
- Participated in web training through Teaching Strategies, Public Schools WORKS and ProSolutions.
- Continued Infinite Campus Training on application processing and onboarding information.
- Translated and assisted with initial family conferences for Spanish-speaking families.
- Facilitated and assisted with the August NCPreK Committee meeting.

#### **Support Coach**

- Assisted with 2 returning staff and 1 new staff member with room set-up before school began.
- Attended training on Community Engagement/Trauma Resilience
- Removed loose toys and equipment from Polk Central for construction of new playground.
- Attended preservice professional development trainings at Central Office.
- Completed training through TSG: Using Positive Guidance for an Inclusive, Collaborative Classroom.
- Ordered consumables for preschool classrooms.

# **Health and Safety**

- Completed Beginning of the Year training and CPR for Staff.
- Emergency Care Plan for Health & Nutritional Needs, along with any needed medications to classroom teachers. Training provided for any emergency medications needed in the classroom.
- Continue to collect Health Assessments and Immunizations for children enrolled. Faxing the doctor's office to get needed information, such as Lead levels, for example if it was not included on their health assessment the doctor completed.
- Children Dental Providers have been assessed and if they do not have a Dental Home, information was provided as well as consent to get on the mobile dental bus that visits our schools. Dental Bus will start making rounds around the middle of September.
- Hearing and Vision Screens are underway.
- IEP evaluations and meetings have also begun for the year. Currently we have 18 of our 80 Head Start Children with IEP at this time.

- Conducted new teacher orientation for Kasey Potter, our new teacher at Polk Central
- Participated in NCPreK Committee Meeting
- Completed mentor training to better assist teachers furthering their education
- Entered all students into TeachingStrategies GOLD platform
- PreK Teachers, Assistants and Staff completed approximately 300 total hours of Professional Development. Training included:

  - \*PreK Kickoff Meeting including Preschool Staff Manual overview, Supervision, Medication Administration, Behavior Support Overview, Family & Community Partnerships, Head Start reporting

  - \*Use of Adaptive Seating with Toni Haley
- Conducted classroom visits
- 123 Parent-Teacher Initial Interaction meetings were conducted (99% of parents participated)
