# Polk County Middle School School Improvement Plan 2025 –2026

**Vision:** We Are One — united to learn, lead, and make a difference.

**Mission:** At our school, We Are One team. We work together, challenge ourselves, support each other, and get ready to take on the world.

### **Goal 1 – MTSS: Behavior Support & Intervention**

**Specific:** Use the MTSS Behavioral Document to track patterns, provide targeted interventions, and reduce repeated behaviors.

**Measurable:** Track the number of behavior incidents per student each six weeks using MTSS documentation, allowing tracking of repeated behaviors.

**Achievable:** Provide MTSS Behavioral Framework PD for staff and ensure counselors meet with all ISS students.

**Relevant:** More targeted support will reduce behavioral disruptions, leading to increased instructional time.

**Time-bound:** Compare baseline data from the first six weeks to each subsequent six-week period.

#### **Action Steps:**

- Implement consistent behavioral documentation for all incidents.
- Provide staff PD on MTSS Behavioral Framework by September.
- Review behavior data each six weeks to identify trends.
- Use PAWS Matrix and character-building lessons in homeroom/advocate time.

**Success Criteria:** Success will be evident when teachers and staff consistently implement behavioral interventions and supports, and students demonstrate improved behavior choices, resulting in a **10% reduction in documented office referral incidents** from the baseline by the end of the 2025–2026 school year.

### Goal 2 - Math: IXL Growth

**Specific:** Use IXL data to measure and improve math proficiency in all grade levels.

**Measurable:** Establish a baseline IXL score within the first six weeks and measure growth each six weeks.

**Achievable:** Provide time in Advocate/Math Day for IXL practice and skill building. Provide staff development on curriculum tied to state standards and CEUs to develop a working pacing guide.

**Relevant:** Targeted skill growth in math aligns with district academic excellence priorities. **Time-bound:** Growth will be measured every six weeks, with a final comparison in May.

#### **Action Steps:**

- Administer IXL baseline assessment in first six weeks.
- Track and compile class and grade-level growth each six weeks.
- Share data with grade-level representatives for SIP updates.
- Recognize grade level with greatest growth each six weeks with vending coupon reward.
- Provide staff development on curriculum tied to state standards and the development of working pacing guides.

**Success Criteria:** By the end of the 2025–2026 academic year, students across the school will demonstrate an average growth of at least **110 points** on the IXL diagnostic assessment, as measured from the beginning to the end of the year. This target reflects growth equivalent to **one year and one month of academic progress**, ensuring that students performing **below, at, or above grade level** are all challenged to meet and exceed expected growth, thereby addressing learning gaps and maintaining high standards for achievement.

### Goal 3 - ELA: STAR Reading Growth

**Specific:** Use STAR Reading data to track and improve literacy skills in all grade levels.

**Measurable:** Establish baseline STAR score within the first six weeks; monitor growth each six weeks.

**Achievable:** Integrate DEAR Day, WIN Day, and targeted reading support during Advocate time. Provide staff development on curriculum tied to state standards and CEUs to develop a working pacing guide.

**Relevant:** Strengthening literacy supports student success across all subject areas. **Time-bound:** Review growth data every six weeks with final measurement in May.

#### **Action Steps:**

- Administer STAR baseline assessment in the first six weeks.
- Track and compile reading growth data for SIP updates.
- Provide targeted small-group or individual reading support during Advocate.
- Recognize grade level with greatest growth each six weeks with vending coupon reward.
- Provide staff development on curriculum tied to state standards and the development of working pacing guides.

**Success Criteria:** By the end of the 2025–2026 academic year, students across the school will demonstrate an average growth of at least **70 points** of Lexile growth on the STAR diagnostic assessment, as measured from the beginning to the end of the year. This target reflects growth equivalent to approximately **one year of academic progress**, ensuring that students performing **below, at, or above grade level** are all challenged to meet and exceed expected growth, thereby addressing learning gaps and maintaining high standards for achievement.

### **Schoolwide Culture & Engagement Initiatives**

- Amazing Race Six-week grade-level competitions promoting citizenship, school pride, and academics (lockers, pencil war, Veterans cards, Kleenex war, canned food drive, library book return).
- **Homeroom & Advocate Structure** Clear academic focus, character-building, and enrichment days to support academic and behavioral goals.
- **Positive Incentives** Vending coupons, slushies, extra free time, dress-up days, and holiday rewards to celebrate growth and achievement.
